Well done and congratulations once again, we are so proud of all of you.

In 2021, we had a total of 17,971 candidates writing the Caribbean Secondary Education Certificate[®] (CSEC[®]) examinations in 33 subject areas, of which 9,730 (54.12%) were females and 8,249 (45.88%) were males.

At the CAPE Level, a total of 8,407 candidates (3,346 males & 5,060 females) registered for CAPE Unit 1 and Unit 11 examinations in 2021.

Thirty-two (32) Unit 1 and thirty-one (31) Unit 11 subjects were written at CAPE.

It is important to note that our overall performance in CAPE continues to be excellent.

The Minister of Education will continue to play a critical role in ensuring we have an educated and trained labour force, which adequately meets the national development needs of Trinidad and Tobago. The Ministry is committed to partnering with all stakeholders and contributing to the achievement of the national development vision and goals of 2030, which are articulated in the National Development Strategy (NDS) or Vision 2030.

Vision 2030 highlights the need for a modern, relevant and accessible education and training system which requires the support of all stakeholders. This provides

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access for all citizens to education, while ensuring the curriculum keeps pace with improvements in technology and meets the needs of the changing world of work.

The Government of Trinidad and Tobago recognises the role that education plays in ensuring future prosperity and economic growth. Therefore, both primary and secondary education are compulsory and free access to public schools is available to girls and boys.

National Consultation on Education 2021-2022:

Many of you would have participated in our recently concluded National Consultation on Education Policy 2021 -2022. I say thank you for your contributions, which the ministry will consider in developing its Draft Education Policy Paper 2022 – 2027. This document will provide the strategic direction necessary to guide our programmes, projects, and action plans for the Early Childhood Care and Education, Primary, Secondary, Technical/Vocational and Tertiary sub-Sectors for the next five (5) years.

In closing, in a bid to improve our education sector, The Ministry of Education has undertaken significant changes, in the areas of teacher training, curriculum reform and digital transformation among others. However, we cannot do it alone so we

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continue to engage our key stakeholders daily, as we navigate challenges such as COVID-19 and other financial and economic and global factors. We recognize the invaluable contribution of our parents, teachers and principals.

This afternoon, as we join with CXC and recognise our eight most outstanding students at the Caribbean Secondary Education Certificate (CSEC) and Caribbean Advanced Proficiency Examinations (CAPE) 2021, I would like to thank all our principals, teachers and parents for their role in supporting the efforts of all of today's awardees.
