Applicants should be aware of the following general conditions of the scholarship:
 Applicants should be aware of the following general conditions of the scholarship: The Government of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago (GoRTT) reserves the right to publish the names of candidates selected for Scholarships. By applying for a scholarship, the candidate gives consent for such publication in the event that his/her application is successful. Recipients will be given a formal <i>Notification of Scholarship</i>, requesting that they indicate their interest in the Scholarship. Formal confirmation of the scholarship will be issued when all conditions have been met. Scholars will be expected to take up the Scholarship, from the date stated by the Government of Republic of Trinidad and Tobago (GoRTT) in its <i>Notification of the Scholarship</i>. Scholars will be expected to pursue full time studies (where it is available locally). Scholars will be expected to reside in Trinidad and Tobago throughout their Scholarship. Scholars may not undertake paid employment during their scholarship without prior consent from the GoRTT. Scholars must not change their programme of study during the tenure of the scholarship except with written permission from the GoVETT). Scholars must maintain satisfactory progress and good standing as stipulated by the academic institution, or the scholarship will be withdrawn and the recipient liable to repay the Government of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago (GoRTT). Scholars must follow the approved programme of study and abide by the rules, regulations and codes of conduct of the academic institution. A suspension from the academic institution will result in immediate suspension of the scholarship and can lead to termination of the scholarship. Allowances are not payable during suspension. Recipients of scholarships will be required to sign a Master Scholarship Labor of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago (GoRTT). The Government of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago ins

Role of the GoRTT	 The Government is responsible for: Disseminating information on the awards; Ensuring that applications at all stages of the process are completed according to requirements; Ensuring that only eligible applicants are shortlisted; Selecting only the most suitable applicants; Assisting successful candidates in their preparations for taking up the awards; and Monitoring the candidates' adherence to the conditions as stipulated in the Master Scholarship Loan Agreement. 		

A. FUNDING

(a) The Government of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago will pay for/or provide:

- i. Tuition and compulsory fees (as indicated by the academic institution);
- ii. Personal Maintenance Allowance;
- iii. (Salary Allowance where applicable to Permanently Appointed Public Officers Only);
- iv. Book Allowance;
- v. Special Equipment Allowance (reimbursable, where applicable); and

vi.Allowance for Support services and/ or Assistive Devices (as approved by Disability Affairs Unit – AADLU, UWI or the academic institution and verified by the Disability Affairs Unit of the Ministry of Social Development and Family Services).

Master's (Taught) / (Research)	2 years

(b) Funding for the duration of study will be guided by the following:

B. ELIGIBILITY:

To apply for this scholarship, applicants must:

- a) Be citizens of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago and must not be a permanent resident of any other country.
- b) Be between the ages of 18 to 50 years.
- c) Provide official medical evidence of their disability.
- d) Be desirous of pursuing an accredited full-time course of study at a locally accredited academic institution
- e) Provide a letter of acceptance, proof of application or enrollment to a locally accredited academic institution
- f) Possess the following academic qualifications

For undergraduate degrees:

(i) A minimum of five (5) CSEC General Proficiency passes with Grades I, II or III, or five (5) GCE O' Level passes with Grade A, B, or C. The subjects passed must include English Language and Mathematics.

With

A minimum of two (2) CAPE subjects at both Units I and II with Grades I, II, or III, or two (2) GCE A' Level subjects with Grades A, B or C;

And

CAPE Caribbean Studies and Communication Studies with Grades I, II, or III, or GCE General Paper with Grades A, B or C.

(ii) Five (5) CSEC General Proficiency passes with Grades I, II or III, or five (5) GCE O' Level passes with Grades A, B, or C. The subjects passed must include English Language and Mathematics.

And

An Associate Degree with a minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.00 or equivalent

Persons who are already in possession of a first degree will not be considered for another first degree.

For a Master's degree:

Applicants must have a Bachelor's degree with at least Lower Second Class Honors.

C. REQUIREMENTS

- (a) Applicants are required to submit two (2) recommendations electronically.
 - i. One must be an academic recommendation and the other, personal or professional;

and

ii. Recommenders must attest to the applicant's ability to perform and succeed as a scholar by providing relevant and practical examples where applicable. This may include a description of any contribution the applicant may have made to institutions/communities/country.

Recommendations must be signed, scanned and uploaded to the online application. Only scanned copies of the signed recommendations will be accepted.

(b) Applicants for a bachelor's degree must prepare and submit an essay '**online**' of no more than 500 words (undergraduate) and 750 words (postgraduate) words which include:

- i. A description/discussion of a developmental need that exists in Trinidad and Tobago;
- ii. A description/discussion of a Programme of Study that deals significantly with the need identified; and
- iii. A description/discussion of how exposure to the selected Programme of Study equips the candidate in meeting the identified need.

D. SELECTION CRITERIA:

Applicants will be assessed and recommended for a scholarship on the following:

- i. Academic merit
- ii. Quality and content of essay
- iii. Interview

(Area A) Work Experience and Volunteer Activities

(Area B) General Competencies

(Area C) Awareness to the needs of the sector

Please note:

- i. Applicants must meet all the requirements of this scholarship to be considered eligible.
- ii. Candidates must attain a minimum score of 50% at the interview in order to be considered for the recommendation of a scholarship.
- iii. The Government of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago is responsible for the selection of suitable candidates.
- iv. An assessment of the applicant's capability will be undertaken by the Ministry of Health .

Applicants must upload the following documents to their 'Online' application:

- Copies of Academic Certificates
- Letter of Acceptance, Proof of Application or Enrollment to an locally accredited academic institution
- Copy of Birth Certificate (with affidavit where necessary)
- Copy of Proof of Change of Name (where necessary)
- Copy of valid form of Trinidad and Tobago identification:
 - Bio data page of Passport
 - Electoral Identification Card (back and front)
 - Driver's Permit
- Persons born outside of Trinidad and Tobago must provide evidence of citizenship (copy) and residency
- Applicants who are Public Officers must upload a signed letter from their Permanent Secretary/Head of Department indicating that they have no disciplinary matters pending;
- Any further documents which you prepared and which provides greater insight into your research proposal
- Other mandatory supporting documents

All originals must be produced upon request.

Applicants must ensure that their information on the attached/uploaded documents are legible at a zoom ratio of 100%. Applicants <u>must not submit documents in 'Zip</u> <u>Folders'</u>. Each document should be uploaded in the relevant field on the upload page. Please ensure that your documents are legible by opening and checking the quality of the document before submitting your application online. Applications with documents which are illegible, cannot be verified and will therefore not be processed.
