A significant number of students from Trinidad and Tobago have also been named on CXC's Regional Merit List for their stellar performances in the June 2024 CAPE and CSEC examinations. Notably, Trinidad and Tobago students ranked first in 19 CAPE subjects, with 194 students

listed on the CAPE Regional Merit List. At the CSEC level, 159 students from Trinidad and Tobago were listed, with top performances in twelve CSEC subjects.
