School Year Calendar Revised – Longer July/August Vacation From 2025

Students and teachers will enjoy a longer July/August vacation starting in the 2025/2026 academic year, following Cabinet's approval of the Ministry of Education's recommendation to revise the school year calendar.

From 2025, the July/August break will be extended from seven (7) to eight (8) weeks, while maintaining the full 39 weeks of instructional time across three terms:

School Term	Beginning	Ending	Weeks
Term I	September 8, 2025	December 12, 2025	14 weeks
Term II	January 5, 2026	March 27, 2026	12 weeks
Term III	April 13, 2026	July 10, 2026	13 weeks

Why the Change?

- Better Term Balance: The revised calendar achieves a more balanced distribution of weeks across the three terms (14-12-13), compared to the previous 15-12-12 arrangement.
- Efficient Infrastructure Works: The extended vacation provides an uninterrupted eightweek period for repairs and upgrades at 278 educational facilities across Trinidad, including ECCE Centres, Primary and Secondary Schools, under the Vacation Repair Programme.
- Staffing Preparedness: The additional week allows the Ministry to fill teacher and administrative vacancies before the start of the new term.

Minister of Education, Dr. the Honourable Michael Dowlath, indicated that:

"This adjustment supports examination readiness, infrastructure upgrades, and staffing needs all without reducing teaching time. Our priority remains delivering quality education in safe, wellmaintained learning environments."

The revised calendar will take effect from September 2025 and has been circulated to all schools.



The Ministry of Education remains committed to keeping stakeholders informed and ensuring a well-prepared and efficient commencement of the new school year.
