## **MOE Executive Team Engages Secondary School Principals** in Strategic Action Plan Forum

Dr. the Honourable. Michael Dowlath, Minister of Education, along with members of the Ministry of Education's (MOE) Senior Executive Team, hosted a high-level engagement forum with Principals of all Government and Government-Assisted Secondary Schools on Wednesday, 20th August, 2025. The event, titled "Leadership in Motion – Action Plan Forum," also welcomed eighteen (18) School Supervisors III, representing the seven Education Districts across Trinidad.

This forum was designed to:


- share the Ministry's strategic vision;

In his remarks, Mr. Claudelle Mc Kellar, Permanent Secretary at the Ministry of Education, highlighted the pivotal role of school leaders in driving educational transformation.

"As Principals, you are not only the guardians of our schools... but also the visionaries who must help translate national educational policies into meaningful daily experiences for our children. It is your blend of leadership and pragmatism that will bridge the gap between strategy and practice, ensuring that ideas become impact," he stated.

In addressing the gathering, Dr. the Hon. Michael Dowlath, Minister of Education, urged Principals and Supervisors to adopt a proactive and values-based approach to school leadership.

"As Principals and School Supervisors, your leadership extends beyond the walls of the school." In today's world, the ability to communicate effectively with society is not optional, it is essential. You are the bridge between the education system and the communities we serve. Approximately 125 Principals were in attendance and engaged actively in the forum, raising critical questions and concerns regarding school operations. Topics discussed included staffing and vacancy management, infrastructure improvements, school security, promotional procedures, and enhancing communication channels between the Ministry and school leadership.

The Ministry of Education remains committed to empowering school leaders and fostering stronger partnerships across schools, families, communities, and national stakeholders ensuring that every student is supported with the best opportunities to succeed.
